#### Headteacher's Note

Broadstone Hall is an inclusive school. We aim to give all our pupils the same opportunities regardless of their race, religion, background, ability and social or emotional need. However, to achieve such equality, some pupils have to have more help than others. For example, those who struggle with reading may receive more support so that they can catch up with other pupils. The same is also true of behaviour.

The vast majority of our pupils behave well, mainly because their social and emotional needs are being met. Not all of our children fit into this group and for complex reasons, or because of a specific condition, they need support with their behaviour, which we give. Now, imagine if we punished those pupils who could not spell or read, instead of helping them to improve? That would not be inclusive practice.

Those pupils who receive behaviour support may have different expectations to suit their need, but let me assure you that poor behaviour always has a consequence. We will always try to ensure that one child's behaviour will not be allowed to have a negative impact on the learning of other children and we put steps in place to ensure this if issues arise and therefore give all pupils the same chances to succeed at Broadstone Hall.

# Open Afternoon

On Friday 21/10/16 we will be having an open afternoon in the hall from 2pm –4pm. This is a chance to see some of the different work that has been going on from Y1-Y6 and speak to some of the pupils about the activities that they have been taking part in. We will also have Mr Owen, our IT staff member, present to show you our website and school app; Mrs Sproson from FOB and Emma Geary, from Stockport Behaviour Support Service, there to speak to you about how she works with the children in our school. We do hope that you can drop in to see us that afternoon.

We will also be holding a separate evening about behaviour management, early in December, to explain how we approach this in a restorative way at school.

Mrs Marron and Mrs Worsley will both be starting their maternity leave this month. Mrs Marron did not have a teaching role in September, but she will be back at school next July, as will Mrs Worsley.
