Winter Surfaces

Our playground surface seems to retain frost and ice longer than the surrounding pavements. So on freezing mornings we send the pupils in by the Reception class corridor to avoid any injuries. Our site staff and sports coaches spend the next two hours salting and scraping the playground so that it is safe. Any patches that are still icy are then coned off to indicate to the pupils that they should not be used as they are still slippy.
