Planning a Story in Y3

This half term in Year 3 we have been planning a story about a fairy tale but we had change something. So you could change the characters personality or you could change the setting.

So we picked a fairy tale then you changed what you wanted to change. I picked Hansel and Gretel. I changed the setting but I only changed one setting. We put our senses in, but we didn't say, "I can see," we had to find another way how to put them in.

We have also been putting subordinating conjunctions in our story because that is what we have been doing in English.

Also we have been doing speech so we have put that in our story and we have been practicing using commas. Our teacher gave us all a target and in our story we had to try and reach that target that the teacher gave us.



Maths in Y5

In Year 5 we have learnt about how to order equivalent fractions.

Take, for example, 3/5 and 5/7. These don't have the same denominator, but we can change them so they do.

Firstly, we change the bottom number (denominator) so they are the same. To do this we have to see what lowest times table goes into the 7 and 5s. This is called the LCM (lowest common multiple), 35 right?

We also must remember that whatever we do to the top we do to the bottom. So how many 5s go into 35? The answer is 7. So we must times the top by seven. Same goes for 5/7.

And in the end we must have an answer something like this 21/35 for 3/5, and for 5/7 we should have 25/35.

Now we can compare these numbers. So 5/7 is bigger than 3/5 because 25/35 is more than 21/35, and that is how you do it.

But if you don't know your times tables you can't order fractions, so get learning Y4 and below!

Religious Education

In Year 3 we have been learning about the Hindu Festival of Diwali. This is a Festival of Light and they light fireworks to celebrate it.

We have written some poems in RE lessons and we were allowed to do a haiku poem or an acrostic poem or a rhyme poem or a free style poem.

I did an acrostic where the start of each line spells out the word Diwali and RAP poem.

We wrote them in our own books but we used guide lines. The poems were all about the different parts of the Diwali Festival.




Staying Alive in Y2

A team of 3 Police officers and one Prison officer brought two scary dogs in.


They came in to school to tell us how to stay safe and how not to get into trouble.
