Play Ground Improvements

You may have noticed that things have been changing on the playground recently to improve the facilities for the children. Despite the difficult financial circumstances in education at the moment, we have been able to access grants from the National Lottery Fund, additional funds from the DfE and the School Sports Grant to pay for playground improvements.

The three muddy areas are being resurfaced with rubber mulch made from recycled tyres, new markings will appear on the playground for games lessons/playtimes and the shelters paid for by FOB donations are being painted by "Good Gym," a local charity run by one of our parents.

I would like to thank them for their support in making the playground a much better area for our children.

Independence and Responsibility

As the pupils move through the school, there is an expectation from us that they become more independent and responsible learners. We feel that it is important for the pupils to develop organisational skills, so that they become responsible for making sure that they have the right equipment for school each day.
