Dear Parents and Carers, I would like to say a big thank you to all of you who attended the KS2 Sports Day last week. One parent stopped me to say how much the children seemed to enjoy the whole event. I would like to thank Mr. McAlpine and the sports coaches for organising the event so well. We are very proud to provide so many opportunities for children to work together in a range of sports activities that are available at the school which include afterschool clubs, lunchtime games and now a before school martial arts club run by Jason Baird. This club operates on a Tuesday morning between 8 and 8:45am and any KS2 pupils are welcome to attend for a fee of £5 per session. Our wraparound care for children operates before school, at lunchtimes, in our afterschool clubs and soon in our new provision; The **Broadstone Hall Post** Learning Hub, starting in September 2019.

Y6 Writing Moderation

The children in Y6 completed their SATs tests before the Whitsun holidays and we will be getting their results very soon. However, they have had to continue working very hard since then as our school was picked for a writing moderation visit by the Local Authority. The children have applied themselves brilliantly to editing and improving examples of their writing (totally independently from their teachers) as is expected in the National Testing and Assessment Arrangements.

The children did really well and the LA assessors were very impressed, not only with the quality of the work that the children had completed, but also by how well the work was organised by the class teachers who were able to demonstrate how well they knew the individual children's work and attainment in writing.
