Reddish Vale Trip.

This term in Year 6 (geography) we have been learning about rivers and the courses of a river. There is the upper course, middle course and the lower course. Doing this, we went on a school trip to Reddish Vale Country Park so that we could see where about the courses were, and see how big the river really was.

We also sketched the middle course of the river as it had an oxbow lake that was forming, tributaries, fast flowing waters and deltas, which are parts of rocks, sticks and sand that have built up over the years in the middle of the river. We then tried to find out how fast the water was flowing by measuring 10m with a measuring tape, then throwing three similar sized sticks - so that it would be a fair test – and threw them one by one, then we timed how long it took for the stick to get to 10m.

When we got back to class, we added all the results of the three attempts then divided it into 30 (because of three attempts and 10m each). Once we had done that, we had our result of how fast the river was forming. It was very muddy there but it was great fun!

My favourite part of the trip was when we got to draw the river because it was really fun trying to match the river in front of us. Although my drawing wasn't perfectly accurate, it was still a great trip overall.
