Music

English

As readers, our whole class guided reading sessions will explore a range of texts, including information texts, all linked to wider curriculum areas.

In our book talk sessions, we will continue to read our class novels and still enjoy our weekly library visits.

As writers, we will link our writing to history and produce texts based on the Roman Empire. The children will be writing non-chronological reports on gladiators and produce a range of narrative texts based on the book 'Escape from Pompeli'.



Mathematics

As mathematicians, we will continue our fractions topic, focusing on comparing and ordering fractions with the same denominators. We will then move on to our mass and capacity unit. The children will be using scales and measuring objects using kilograms and grams. We will also continue with our daily fluency sessions focusing on the four operations.

Science

As scientists, we will be finishing our light topic, investigating reflection and shadows. We will then start our plant unit. We will be identifying and describing the functions of different parts of flowering plants (roots, stem/trunk, leaves and flowers). We will also explore the requirements of plants for life and growth.
