The Year 1s are looking forward to some exciting learning during the term.

Music

As musicians, the children will be exploring the song 'Use your imagination'. The unit will encourage children to explore music creatively through listening, singing, improvisation and playing instruments such as glockenspiels.

Geography

As geographers, the children will be learning about the four countries in the United Kingdom and then focusing on the Isles of Scilly. They will explore human and physical features before comparing it to our local area.

Personal, Social & Health Education.

As safe and responsible learners we will be focusing on road safety. We will explore the different types of crossings and how we can use them to cross the road safely. We will also learn the 'stop, look and listen' rule. The children will look at different scenarios both real and imaginative where they can consider the right choice and how to be safe crossing the roads. We will continue with our weekly Happy Minds lessons focusing on our wellbeing.

English

As readers, the children will continue to enjoy a range of texts, including those linked to our class author and other prominent children's authors. Our whole class reading session

As writers, we will be reading 'counting creatures' and 'one mole digging a hole' to support our learning of -es, -ed and -ing suffixes. We will continue to focus on spelling Common Exception words correctly when writing independently.

Mathematics

As mathematicians we will explore our understanding of numbers to 100. We will look at odd and even numbers, tens and ones and estimating on number lines. We will then start to learn about money. The children will explore the different coins and notes. We will then begin to explore time including days of the week, morning and afternoon and telling time to the hour.

Art

As artists, we will be identifying primary colours and exploring how secondary colours can be mixed. We will recreate artist Jasper Johns artwork. We will also create different shades of secondary colours by mixing two primary colours and using these in a decorative painting.

R.E

As respectful thinkers we will be finding out more about Islam, key beliefs and ways of living for Muslims. Pupils will learn about some of the key Muslim beliefs, encounter stories about the Prophet and find out about what these teach Muslims today about ways of living. Pupils will learn about the five pillars of Islam and how these impact upon the lives of believers.

Science

As scientists, we will be exploring materials. We will be investigating how different materials are suitable to build houses. We will get to build our very own houses out of a range of materials and test they are suitable to withstand wind. The children will also be building roofs for our houses making sure they are waterproof. We will even get to build furniture to put in our houses!

P.E

As athletes the children will continue to focus on the core fundamental skills, such as running, jumping, throwing and catching. The children will work on team skills, simple tactics and coordination activities.

Computing

As computing citizens, we will continue to look at the basics of computer programming. The children will create simple algorithms, understand instructions (sequencing) and use coding tools to solve problems.

History

As historians, we will be exploring the monarchy in Britain and how it has changed over time. The children will learn about significant past and present monarchs as well as the castles they live in.
