MUSIC As musicians, the children will be building on their skills of playing the recorder, learning new notes. They will also learn to sing Living on a Prayer by Bon Jovi. They will combine this knowledge to attempt a musical rendition of the song.



### **History**

As historians, the children will be studying the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. They will be exploring where and when they came to Britain and why. They will also be exploring specific events and how life changed in Britain during this time, including the introduction of Christianity to Britain.



### **Art & Design Technology**

As artists, the children will be exploring installation art-(sculpture / 3D) and working collaboratively in groups to create their own installation based on space

As technologists, children will be exploring different mechanisms to design and make their own pop-up book.



### Personal, Social & Health

Education. As citizens, the children will learn about what peer pressure is and how we can help ourselves and others when faced with positive and negative peer pressures. As well as this, the children will be developing their understanding of the working world and enterprise.

### **English**

As readers, the children will be reading an adapted version of Shakespeare's Macbeth and Beowulf. They will be exploring the settings and different characters in the book.

They will continue to read a range of texts in Whole Class Guided Reading to develop their reading skill as well as reading for pleasure in class.

As writers, the children will be using the texts as stimulus to write for a variety of different purposes and audiences. This will include: descriptions, balanced arguments and letter writing



#### **Mathematics**

As mathematicians, the children will be introduced to angles, learning how to classify them and how to measure them using a protractor.

The children will also further develop their knowledge and understanding of decimals and units of measurement. They will also have focused lessons to consolidate their arithmetic skills



### Computing

In computing, the children will be learning about 3D modelling using Purple Mash. They will explore how to create and manipulate 3D objects, using different tools to design and build their own models. The children will be encouraged to use their creativity to plan and present their own 3D designs.

Science As scientists, the children will be learning about Living Things and their Habitats. Through this topic, they will learn the life cycles of mammals, birds, insects and amphibians from embryo to old age.
