Welcome to the Broadstone Hall Primary School Newsletter!

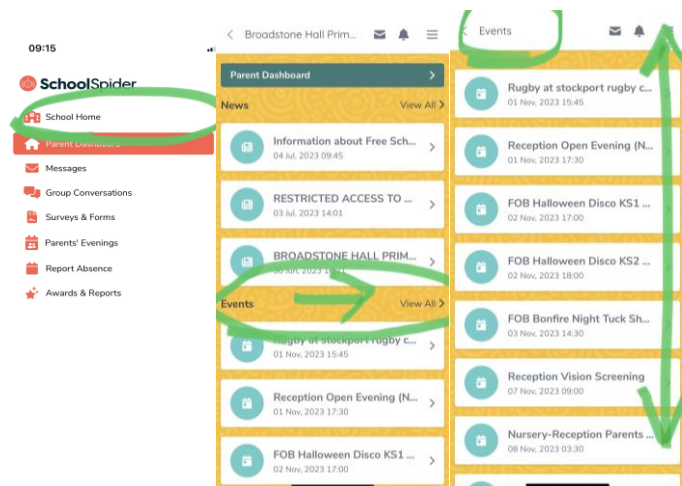
HEADTEACHERS NOTE:

Welcome back to Summer (1), although a brief term – it's a busy one. Please keep up to date with all events available to view on our School Spider app or on the school website.

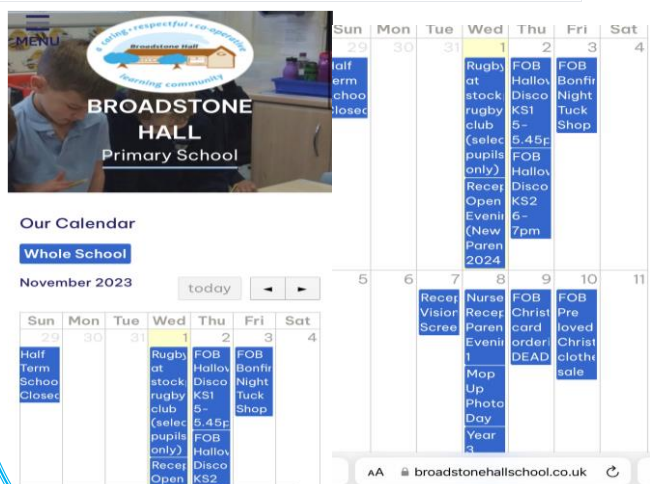
HOW TO FIND THE SCHOOL CALENDAR ON SCHOOL SPIDER
